


## I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on General and Omnibus Matters held a public hearing at 9:00 a.m., Monday, October 16, 2006 in the Public Hearing Room, I Liheslaturan Guåhan. Public notice was given to all media (see facsimile confirmation page) on October 09 and October 13 and listed in the Government Meeting Section of the PDN on Thursday, October 12, 2006.

## II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY

Individuals that appeared before the Committee to present oral and written testimony on the bill were as follows:

**Mr. Henry Dela Cruz, Computer System Analyst II, Guam Public Library System, oral testimony in support of Bill 286.** He noted that the Bill would allow the library to procure internet access for its patrons at far lower rates than those associated with connecting to the Gov Guam network. He also stated in response to Senator Klitzkie that the GSA is requiring GPLS to use IT&E since they have a contract to be the Internet Service Provider for the Government of Guam.

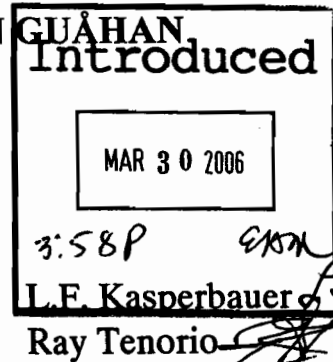
## FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATION

The Committee finds that Bill No. 286 (LS) would provide the Guam Public Library System with options to provide public internet access to their patrons. Currently, the Guam Public Library System is only Gov Guam agency that offers free internet access to the General Public. GPSS, UOG and GCC all offer internet access to their students and faculty and many of the employees of the Government of Guam may access the internet through the secured Gov Guam net work but they are not expected to provide general public access. The Committee further finds that the Gov Guam data network which uses a network topology of dedicated data lines such as T-1s, fractional T-1s, DS and OC lines is intended to provide network connectivity strictly among agencies of the Government of Guam and not for public internet access. Such dedicated data lines cost 10 to 20 times more for the same amount of bandwidth as comparable DSL, Cable or wireless consumer priced products.

As the branch libraries reopen, Bill No. 286 (LS) will allow those branches to use DSL, Cable and wireless internet access for internet that is accessible by the public.

6 **“§80126. Procurement of DSL, cable and wireless broadband services.**

7 The Guam Public Library System is authorized to procure from private  
8 companies doing business on Guam, DSL (Digital Subscriber Lines) services,  
9 cable television/internet services and or wireless broadband services as a means of  
10 providing internet accessibility for its employees and patrons. In the procurement  
11 of such services, the Guam Public Library System shall consider the cost, the  
12 amount of bandwidth, and the reliability of the service. The Department of  
13 Administration shall not require the Guam Public Library system to use the  
14 Government of Guam’s data network for the purpose of providing internet access  
15 to its employees and patrons.

# Fifth man sentenced in postal ice scheme

Another man who helped smuggle ice from Las Vegas to Guam through the U.S. Postal Service was sentenced yesterday to 6 years in prison.

John V. Cruz, 35, had pleaded guilty in Aug. 30, 2005, to conspiracy to distribute methamphetamine hydrochloride, according to court documents.

From November 2004 to June 2005, he was involved with five other men in shipping parcels from Las Vegas to Guam containing ice to a post office box. The scheme involved sending parcels containing as little as 1 to 4 ounces of ice and up to 8 to 113 grams of ice, Pacific Daily News files state.

In June 2005, Guam Customs and Quarantine and the United States Postal Inspector inter-

cepted one of those parcels leading to the arrest of six men. Cruz is the fifth defendant in the case to be sentenced. Visiting Judge John Coughenour also ordered Cruz to 5 years supervised release.

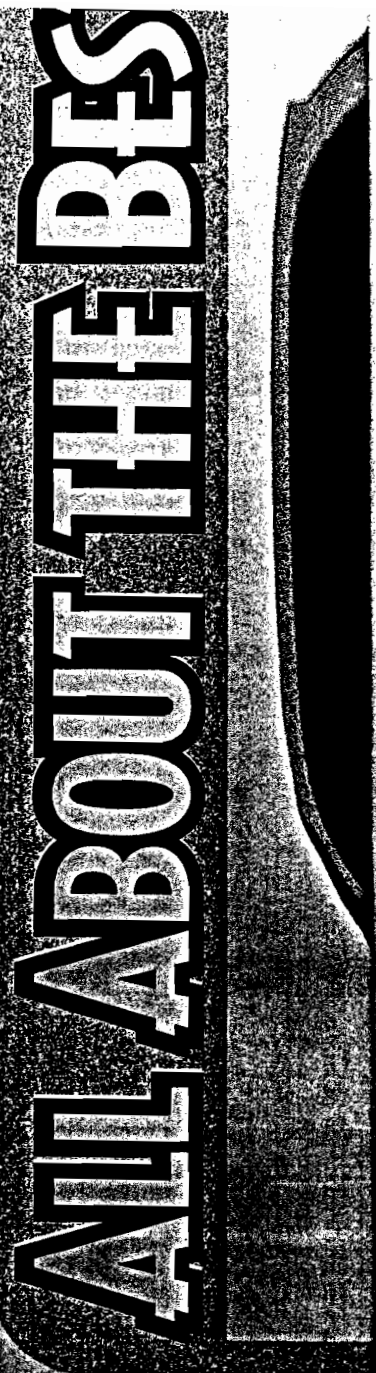
