1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2 **Section One.** Title 4 G.C.A., Chapter 1, §1103 (c) is amended to read:

I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Judiciary, Governmental Operations, and Reorganization held a public hearing on Bill 390 (EC) on November 27, 2006 at 9:00am in the Guam Legislature public hearing room in Hagatna, Guam. Notice of public hearing was disseminated throughout all local media.

Summary of testimony:

Chief Justice F. Phillip Carbuillido of the Supreme Court presented oral testimony in support of Bill 390 (EC). The Chief Justice stated that he supports the intent of the bill to prohibit personal chauffeuring of judges and justices to and from their places of residence. He also highlighted that the courts have a current vehicle policy in place which addresses the authorized uses of government vehicles by all employees.

Findings & recommendations:

Bill 390 (EC) eliminates the Presiding Judge of the Superior Court of Guam and the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Guam from provisions of Title 4 G.C.A., Chapter 1, § 1103 which allow personal use of government vehicles.

Chief Justice F. Phillip Carbuillido of the Supreme Court presented testimony on Bill 390 (EC) during the hearing of 27 November. In discussing the purpose and intent of the bill, the Chief Justice stated that his belief is that it is to prohibit personal chauffeuring of judges and justices to and from their residence. The Chief Justice commented that "if that is intent of bill, then I support Bill 390."

The committee finds that based on the support of the Chief Justice and evidence during the hearing that there is no public opposition, Bill 390 (EC) is a salutary that symbolizes frugality in the Judiciary.

Accordingly, the Committee on Judiciary, Governmental Operations, & Reorganization does hereby submit its findings and recommendation to **DO PASS Bill 390 (EC), AN ACT TO AMEND TITLE 4 G.C.A., CHAPTER 1, § 1103(c) RELATIVE TO APPLYING THE PROHIBITION OF GOVERNMENT VEHICLES FOR PERSONAL USE TO THE PRESIDING JUDGE OF THE SUPERIOR COURT OF GUAM & THE CHIEF JUSTICE OF THE SUPREME COURT OF GUAM**, as introduced.



The proposed legislation calls for application of the prohibition of government vehicles for personal use to both the Presiding Judge of the Superior Court of Guam and the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Guam. It appears that legislative intent is to offset benefits afforded by P.L. 28-137 (a.k.a. Judicial Efficiency Act of 1996) including annual compensation adjustments by applying a corresponding reduction in other benefits, namely the use of government vehicles for personal use. The Bureau estimates that cost savings will be approximately \$12,000 per annum (2 vehicles at \$6,000 per year per vehicle including vehicle value, auto insurance and fuel cost).
