

MISSION STATEMENT:

The PEALS Board is one of the 55 member Boards which compose the National Council of Examiners for Engineering and Surveying (NCEES), the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards (NCARB), and Western Council of Architectural Registration Boards (WCARB).

The mission of the Professional Engineers, Architects and Land Surveyors (PEALS) Board is to safeguard life, health, property, and public welfare through the regulation of the practice of professional engineering, architecture and land surveying in Guam by:

- Ensuring that those entering the practice meet standards of competency by way of education, experience, and examination;
- Establishing standards of practice for those licensed to practice;
- Requiring that any person practicing or offering to practice engineering, architecture and land surveying be licensed;
- Providing information for the public to make informed decisions;
- Focus on prevention, providing information and educational materials to consumers, candidates, clients, licensees, and others. Be progressive in utilizing the most advanced means of providing services; and
- Enforcing the laws, codes and standards governing engineering, architectural and land surveying practice in a fair, expeditious and uniform manner.

GOALS AND OBJECTIVES:

- Ensure the professional qualifications of those practicing engineering, architecture and land surveying by setting requirements for education, experience, and examination.

- Protect consumers by preventing violations and effectively enforcing laws, codes, and standards when violations occur.
- Increase public awareness of Professional Engineers, Architects and Land Surveyors (PEALS) Board's mission, activities and services.
- To improve effectiveness of relationships with other organizations in order to further PEALS Board missions and goals.
- To enhance organization development and effectiveness.
- Improve the quality of customer service in all programs.

- To administer the qualifying examinations to engineering, architecture and land surveying applicants in accordance with prescribed policies, regulations and procedures developed by the National Council of Examiners for Engineering and Surveying, the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards and California Board of Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors.
- To seek adequate funding to support the Board operating costs including recruitment of permanent Board Investigator.
- To amend and update the Rules of Professional Conduct for Professional Engineers, Architects and Land Surveyors licensed with this Board.
- To revise and update the PEALS Law, and Rules and Regulations
- To coordinate the conduct of refresher courses on engineering, architecture and land surveying with various professional associations.
